Each room has its own water heater and its own hot air furnace. So that when a unit is moved it is simply a matter of disconnecting the utilities and removing copper stripping holding the units together.

Stainless Steel

Each classroom has its own stainless steel sink with hot and cold running water, a feature lacking in many of the youngsters' homes.

The school was built as a portable school because of the shifting population. Mrs. Stevens says that its green shingles and maroon and yellow trim make it look like a country school and its yard will be open until 5:30 p.m. on Saturdays and 6:00 p.m. on school days. It is the only yard most of the youngsters have for playing.

The school's multi purpose room serves as cafeteria, auditorium, music room, library and indoor gym on rainy days.
